Re: **Oppose H.R. 2164 the “Legal Workforce Act”**

Dear Representative:

We write today to express in the strongest possible terms our opposition to H.R. 2164, the “Legal Workforce Act”. H.R. 2164 would mandate the use of the bureaucratic E-Verify system and for the first time in history require every American to be checked against an error prone government database. If a worker’s information is incorrect in E-Verify, he or she can’t work until the problem is resolved. In addition to

2004, more than 510 million records have been hacked, lost or improperly disclosed including E-verify databases.<sup>3</sup> In October 2009, and again in Decem
